Large adult dog adopters and fosters urgently needed

Canine intake numbers at the Charlottesville-Albemarle SPCA are at a record high. We need to empty our kennels so we can be ready to save more lives. We have an urgent need for large adult dog adopters and fosters. Adoptions are by appointment only. Potential adopters should submit an application on the website and a staff member will contact them to schedule an appointment time. For those interested in fostering, we provide everything they need to take care of the animal at no cost to them.

In an effort to promote adoptions, the SPCA will be holding a "St. Pawtrick's Day" adoption special from March 17th-March 19th. During the special, adult animals will be just \$17 to adopt (some exclusions may apply.)

"With the weather warming up, now is the perfect time to bring home a new pet," said Angie Gunter, Chief Executive Officer of the Charlottesville-Albemarle SPCA. "The more kennels we have available at our shelter, the more lives we can save."

All animals included in the adoption special will be microchipped and spayed/neutered.
