



Charlottesville-Albemarle SPCA Hosting Reduced Cost Clinic with Vaccinations and Microchips

CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA (May 28, 2024) – The Charlottesville-Albemarle SPCA is thrilled to announce our upcoming Compassionate Care Clinic, a key community outreach event aimed at ensuring all pets receive the essential care they need, regardless of their owners' income levels. This special clinic will take place at Tonsler Park, located at 500 Cherry Avenue in Charlottesville, on Friday, May 31st, from 11 AM to 3 PM. We will offer pet vaccinations and microchips at free or reduced costs to qualified community members. The free vaccines are made possible and distributed by Petco Love's national vaccination initiative, Vaccinated and Loved. Petco Love is working to provide one million more free pet vaccines to existing animal welfare partners, including the Charlottesville-Albemarle SPCA, for family pets in need.

Our Care-A-Van and clinic staff will be on-site to provide the following services:

Microchips – \$25 Rabies – \$15 Bordetella – \$15 DAPP – Free FVRCP – Free

We believe that everyone should have access to affordable veterinary services and our goal of these outreach efforts is to make veterinary care accessible to all, helping to bridge the gap for families who might otherwise struggle to afford these necessary services. Therefore, to qualify for these services, clients must show proof of public assistance. Acceptable forms of proof include an EBT Card, proof of disability, Medicaid, SNAP, unemployment, or WIC. This requirement helps us ensure that those most in need receive the care and support their pets deserve.

"Our Compassion Clinics are a testament to our commitment to serving all members of our community," said Sierra Stevens, Marketing and Communications Manager at the SPCA. "By providing these essential services at reduced costs, we hope to enhance the health and wellness of pets in our community. Preventative care, such as vaccinations, plays a critical role in protecting all pets from common, but deadly, diseases, ensuring they live long, healthy lives."
